Experiences in the arts.



When we left our campus for spring break in March of 2020, we couldn't have imagined the urgent shift to remote learning in the context of a global health emergency. While our nation and world is still navigating the health situation of COVID-19, we are no longer in a sudden crisis. During the past few months and for the remainder of the summer, we are planning to be back to in person learning this fall with provisions to shift to remote learning if mandated.

On Campus Learning

We will be on campus for in-person classes all 5 days a week for all students. We will follow a phased approach for opening (outlined on next page), which takes into consideration guidelines and recommendations from Centers for Disease Control (CDC), Minnesota Department of Health (MDH), and Minnesota Department of Education (MDE).



Standard drop-off and pick-up times will remain the same for all divisions.




Before and after school care will be offered.

Preparing for Interruptions

Following the recommendations from our re-entry task force and lessons from this past spring, we are preparing for possible interruptions. In the event our local community experiences a spike in COVID-19 cases that impacts our physical operations, a shift to blended or distance learning will happen for a period of time.



Life On-Campus | Phase I

The following modifications will be made for the start of the school year. We will re-assess after a few weeks to determine when we move between the phases of campus life.



Entry/Exit Doors will be assigned by grade-level to control student traffic. District 833 will determine & communicate bus protocols.



Physical distancing will be utilized when possible in each classroom.



Sanitizing and cleaning processes have increased in frequency throughout the school day.



Campus access to parents and visitors is minimized.



Art, music, and Spanish specials will come to the classrooms for EE/LS.



It is not advised by the CDC that children wear masks for prolonged periods. Masks are not required but students may opt to wear them in common spaces.



Group gatherings will be eliminated during Phase I. Chapel will livestream into classrooms.



Passing times will be staggered and lockers will not be used to minimize student contact in hallways.



Bag lunches (from home or purchase from school) will be eaten in the classrooms. Full cafeteria service, Common Grounds, and A la Carte will not be offered in Phase I.

Confidence in Health and Safety

Standards of Care: Our priority will always be the health and safety of our students, faculty, and staff. We are developing Standards of Care for us all to work **together as one community** in keeping each other safe.

Nursing Staff:


MDE guidelines require 1 nurse per 750 students. NLA will exceed guidelines and employ 1 full-time nurse and 1 part-time nurse for this school year (1.5/750).



Sanitation/Disinfection:

NLA will increase frequency of cleaning and enhance cleaning protocols on campus. Hand sanitizer will be placed in all classrooms and common spaces. Regular sanitation and deep cleaning procedures will be implemented.

Health & Screening

Parents will be asked to take their child's temperature each day before coming to school. If your child is sick or exhibiting any COVID-19 symptoms, please keep them home.*

Quarantine Procedures

Any person that has tested positive or been exposed to COVID-19 should be quarantined for 10 days. Return to school after 3 days of being symptom free (for positive cases).*


On-Campus with precautions



We will be on campus with in-person learning. The year will begin with some precautions in Phase I that will ease as we progress through the year.

Hybrid/Blended learning



A blended model will allow those who are high risk or quarantined due to illness to continue learning from home.*

3

Distance Learning



We are preparing for potential interruptions to on-campus learning in the event there is a COVID-19 spike.*

**An Academic Committee is currently developing blended and distance learning models should they be needed. Details will be available on August 1. This Academic Team is focused on 4 areas: Standard of Excellence is consistent between on-campus and off-campus learning, Alignment of the school day and consistency of schedules, Delivery system and resources, Community connection and support.*

Students logged in each day and were held accountable for their work while we extended grace when needed.
